Frances Thomas' Whole Wheat Roll Recipe

These delicious rolls were enjoyed at our January meeting.
Thank you Frances.

Measure into mixing bowl: ½ c. warm water (110-115)

Add, stirring to dissolve 2 pkg. dry yeast.

Stir in: 1 ½ c lukewarm milk

½ c sugar	2 eggs
2 t salt	½ shortening

Add half of 7 to 7½ c sifted flour. Sift only white flour. I use 3c whole wheat flour & 4 ½ c of unbleached white flour. After adding ½ of flour beat with mixer until smooth. Add enough remaining flour to handle easily. Turn on floured board and knead until smooth and elastic. About 5 min. Place in greased bowl. Grease top of dough. Cover with damp cloth. Let rise in warm place (85) until double about 1 ½ hr. Punch down. Let rise again for 30 min. Divide dough for rolls. I make them in balls about 20 to 24 in a 9 x 13 pan. Cover and let rise until about double. Bake in 370 oven until gold brown. When making cinnamon rolls and homemade donuts, I use 5 cups of white flour and 2 ½ whole wheat.
