Thanks to Leon Frohn, Alois Hoffman, Mike Swiney, Joe Swiney, Mike Holder, Richard Adams and son Kurt, Dennis Ficken, JR Baker, Bob Stonum, Dan Bockhold, Wayne Russell, Fred Seaman, and Jim Peeper for giving their Sunday afternoon to work. Mary Frohn, Peggy Hoffman, Toni Swiney, Amy Swiney, Carolyn Holder, and Mary Peeper were also there and made plans for the concession stand and prepared the raffled tickets as well as organized the meal when the work was done. Thanks ladies.

Following the meal, a meeting was called to order but President Hoffman. Alois expressed appreciation to Richard, Kurt, and Dennis for their work and equipment. The members voted to give hats to Richard, Kurt, Mrs. Adams, and Dennis Ficken for their work and use of their equipment. Our bank balance was reported to be about \$5100. The cost of the septic tank and pipe was about \$1100 and the rough in for the plumbing was about \$300. It was voted that we would concrete an area about 30 ft X 20 ft. The bathroom will be handicapped accessible. There will also be a closet built to hold cooking and other items that need to be left in the building. It was decided that there would need to be a hot water heater in the bathroom so we could have hot water to wash dishes with. It was moved that Mary purchase a 3 bowl sink that meets health standards. The bathroom will be for members only, not open to the public. Alois also talked about the Montgomery City and Pinckneyville Shows the weekend of Aug 16-19<sup>th</sup>. Both feature Case. Heritage Club will be at Pinckneyville.

It was announced that Mike and Toni Swiney gave a Case Highly Detail Ed. 1/16<sup>th</sup> DC3 Gas Toy Tractor for the raffle. Mary Sorrells donated a handmade quilt. Hats will be given to those members as a thanks for their donations.

The enclosed raffle tickets are to be sold for our yearly fund raiser. The raffle and concession stand are how we are able to do things such as the bathroom in the building. ### **Directions to the Hartz farm:**

From Kingdom City:

From I 70 take US 54 south 13.5 miles to MO BB

Turn left on BB for 9.5 miles

Turn left on County Road 480 for 1.3 miles (long horn cattle in pasture on right just before the corner)

Turn right on County Road 489 (4 mail boxes on the corner - 3 black and 1 white)

Take 489 south 0.6 miles, drive way is on the left (Red and white pole barn). It's the last drive way before the road turns into a lane.

From Jefferson City:

Take MO 94 east for approx. 10 miles

Turn left on MO AA for approx. 2 miles

Turn right on MO BB for approx. 3.5 miles

Turn right on County Road 480 (long horn cattle in pasture on left at corner)

Follow directions from above for the rest of the trip

### **Directions to Pinckneyville, ILL – 4 options**

1) Interstate 70 to I-270 around the North side of St. Louis and continue on to I-70 east to Greenville, IL. Take Hwy 127 South to Pinckneyville. At the center of town take Hwy 154 West to Hwy 13 “Y” and stay on 154. You will then follow the signs to the fairgrounds. A left turn off 154 almost ¼ mile past the intersection.

2) I-70 to Wentzville, MO and South on 40/61 which becomes I-64 through St. Louis and into Illinois. Go to Nashville, IL and then South to Pinckneyville and follow directions in option #1. (NOTE – construction slowdowns from 270 to Poplar Street Bridge)

3) I-70 to Wentzville, MO and South on 40-61 to I-270 South continue on I-255 into Illinois (same interstate, name changes). South on Illinois Route 3 to south of Columbia, IL. Head East on Highway 158 to Douglas-Freeburg Rd #47 to south on Floraville-Paderborn road #9. Right onto Hwy 159, 2 miles and then left on Hwy 156 to Hwy 13. Right onto Hwy 13 and continue until you come to Pinckneyville and make right at “Y” junction with Hwy 154 and go until you see signs to the fairgrounds requiring a left turn.

4) I-70 to Wentzville, MO and South on 40-61 to I-270 South continue on I-255 into Illinois (same interstate, name changes). South on Illinois Rt 3 to Red Bud. Stay going east thru Red Bud on 154 all the way top Pinckneyville. Coming into Pinckneyville, look for signs showing a right turn toward the fairgrounds.
